Hello Church.

In my podcast, I have started to unpack "the Acts of the Apostles", known commonly as the book of Acts. One of the things that I am continually amazed at is how the lives of the Apostles had become so radically different in just a few months. Their Rabbi Jesus whom they had followed for three years had been crucified, raised from the dead, ascended into heaven and then they received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Now they were going to the Temple – preaching there and calling fellow Jews to repent and to turn to God.

How do the Apostles go from having their Rabbi around to not having him around – at least physically anymore? And how do they go from living with fear and threats to being transformed into trusting lives, confidently proclaiming Jesus in the temple – even as they are thrown into prison for it? I find it hopeful that their confidence and power certainly comes from Jesus Christ and not from them. Thankfully, they had faith in the power of God for their lives.

Well, here we are – one week away from Christmas Eve – and what an unusual Christmas it will be. But God has given us Jesus Christ and his apostolic message is still being proclaimed to audiences like us who need to hear it. This message comes to us during this time of year through the Word and Sacrament and through the gift of music – and if not in person, we can hear it digitally. And it is still proclaimed boldly not because we have any power to do so, but because this proclamation comes from God, in Jesus Christ, through the Holy Spirit. I hope that you will find opportunities to hear this message, worship with us and respond as we look forward to the hope of a New Year, with new intentions of turning to God.

One of the ways that we can express our love and our faith is through our offerings of commitments, gifts and tithes. Last Sunday you heard from several of our church members on why it is important to give especially during a pandemic. Earlier this week you received a letter from me about our Commitment Sunday this Sunday. I hope that you will prayerfully consider how you can share in the ministries of this church.

This Sunday we will proclaim God's Word through New Covenant's Concert of Worship. I hope that you will follow us and worship on Sunday or whenever it is convenient for you as we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Advent and prepare for our Christmas celebration. The Concert of Worship is a gift from many people – Patti Kruse, Suzanne Miller, Carl Dees, Clarey Dees, Ali Hosseini, Mary Cole and many other musicians, readers and presenters. But I think that they would all say that it is not them, but Jesus Christ who offers this Word – the Gospel, through music. They are merely God's instruments. Please join us at 10:00 am as we worship this Sunday!
