Yesterday (Wednesday) felt like one of those days for me. As I watched the chaos inside the capitol building from my TV, I was stunned. I have spoken about how divided we are as a nation, but yesterday, I saw the consequences of that division and they were alarming. As Christians we have a unique calling – to shine the light of Christ into this world. Yet we cannot shine the light if we are consumed with hatred, vengeance, self-righteousness and rancor.

Today I am praying for those who lost their lives and were injured in the melee. I am also praying for an end to the deep divisions that have agitated us as a nation. Today I am praying for those who feel that their voices are not being heard, that they find more peaceful ways to air their concerns. And mostly, I am praying for us as Christians to be the light of Christ for this world. Let's be the light of Christ!

This Sunday we will look at that calling as we begin our new sermon series called, "Living Your Life: Baptism to Discipleship!" Mark 1:4-11 is Mark's report of John the Baptist and Jesus' baptism. We will look at the very first step toward discipleship – baptism. When were you baptized? Do you know who was there? How have you been reminded of that event throughout your life? These are important questions that will enable us to begin to focus on how we can live our lives with joy – with Jesus! I hope that you will join us this Sunday!



would be needed by the Thursday before your worship service. Sign up on the link at the top of this E-Weekly email and contact the office with questions. Thank you!






