This Sunday we are in the 2nd Sunday of Lent and our Scripture comes from Luke 13:31-35. **This is a story of grief.** Thinking about grief reminds me of my father. After sitting at my Father's beside the last two days of his life, I remember something peculiar about me when he died. I didn't cry. I wondered about that for days and after some time for reflection, I remembered the day that he told us that he had terminal cancer, two years earlier. I cried that day and I cried many days after that. I think that I began to grieve his death, even while he was living - for those whole two years. Grief is like that.

Jesus sees a city (Jerusalem) that does not have time for him. He pursues her with love, and she rejects his desire to protect and save her. Jesus did not run away from Jerusalem and Jesus will not run away from us. His love for us is too great. His purpose is to bring healing, wholeness, forgiveness, peace, and eternal life. Jesus desires to protect and save you and me too. How long will we resist Jesus?


